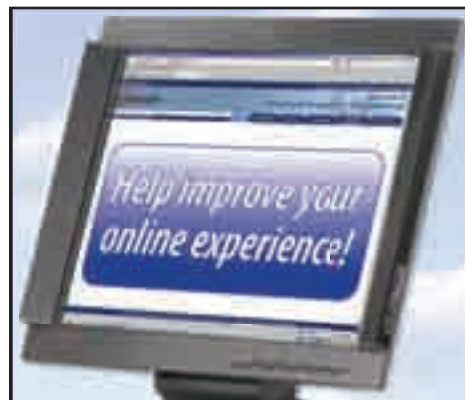

- 18 years of age
- the owner or tenant of land in Markham or the spouse of such an owner or tenant, and
- not disqualified to run by statute.

Qualified individuals interested in running for local offices (municipality and school board) must file a nomination form with the Town Clerk (submitted in person by the applicant or their agent).

Nomination forms are available from the Clerk's Department and online at www.markham.ca.

Completed nomination forms must be accompanied by the prescribed fee (\$200 for head of council, \$100 for all other offices) along with appropriate identification (photo identification, proof of age, residency, citizenship and residency). The fee is payable by cash, debit card, certified cheque, or money order (payable to the Town of Markham).

Candidates must not spend or raise funds for their election campaign until their nomination has been filed with the Town Clerk.
