NOTICE Intention to Designate a Property / Ontario Heritage Act

The Council of the City of Markham intends to designate the following property for reasons of cultural heritage value or interest pursuant to the *Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990*, Chapter O.18, Part IV:

Christian and Nancy Hoover House 10224 Highway 48 Markham, ON

The Christian and Nancy Hoover House has design and physical value as a fine representative example of a late-nineteenth century Ontario Classic farmhouse. This house is also one of Markham's best examples of polychromatic or patterned brickwork, a style that originated as a revival of the colourful brickwork of Medieval Venice that was in vogue in Southern Ontario from the mid-1840s to the 1880s. The Christian and Nancy Hoover House has historical value or associative value representing the religious and cultural mosaic theme of Pennsylvania German Mennonites being attracted to Markham Township in the early nineteenth century. Further, the property has contextual value as a farmhouse historically linked to the rural community of Milnesville. It is one of several local properties historically associated with other Pennsylvania-German families including Koch, Wideman, Raymer, Byer and other members of the Hoover family.
