## NOTICE Intention to Designate a Property / Ontario Heritage Act

The Council of the City of Markham intends to designate the following property for reasons of cultural heritage value or interest pursuant to the *Ontario Heritage Act*, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18, Part IV:

Robson and Amanda Jewitt House 4180 Nineteenth Avenue Markham, ON

The Robson and Amanda Jewitt House has design value and physical value as a representative example of a village dwelling in the Ontario Classic style The Robson and Amanda Jewitt House has historical value and associative value, representing the theme of urban development, specifically the nineteenth century development of the historic mill hamlet of Almira centred around the combined grist mill and woolen mill established by Benjamin Bowman on Bruce Creek in 1844. Further, the property has contextual value as one of a grouping of older buildings that are important in defining, maintaining and supporting the character and extent of the historic community of Almira. The property is historically related to the nearby site of the Amira Mills at 4160 Nineteenth Avenue.
