

NOTICE
Intention to Designate a Property / Ontario Heritage Act

The Council of the City of Markham intends to designate the following property for reasons of cultural heritage value or interest pursuant to the *Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18, Part IV*:

Jesse and Hulda Raymer House
11109 Highway 48
Markham, ON

The Jesse and Hulda Raymer House has design value and physical value as a representative example of an American Foursquare farmhouse and has historical value as it makes legible the evolution of Markham's agricultural community. Notably the expansion or replacement of farmsteads in the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries as farming families became well established and economic fortunes improved. Further, the property has contextual value because it is physically, functionally, visually and historically linked to its surroundings as a farmhouse which has stood on this rural property from c.1915.

Any person may notify the City of Markham of their objection in writing, which shall include the reasons for their objection and all relevant facts, **on or before 4:30 p.m. July 8, 2026** to be sent by registered mail or dropped off in person to:
