TRAFFIC SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS



Your voice matters! City has implemented series of traffic safety improvements in 2016 in responding to resident's safety concerns and feedbacks which includes:

John McCrae PS - New school crossing guard services implemented at the intersection of Fred McLaren Blvd & Stricker Ave. Stonebridge Rd. & Wilfred Murison Ave. - "School Zone" signage implemented to address speeding and safety concerns at Stonebridge Public School.

William Berczy Blvd. - Pedestrian Crossing signs were installed at Hua Du Ave to address pedestrian safety concerns.

Castlemore Ave. – "No U-turn" signs in School Zone implemented at Castlemore Public School & All Saints Catholic Elementary school to improve traffic safety

Angus Glen Blvd. - Implemented speed reduction signage in advance of the curve near Royal Troon Cres to inform drivers to take additional care as they approach.

William Berczy Blvd. – White edgeline pavement markings implemented to reduce travel lanes and lower vehicle speeds Stonebridge Dr. – White edgeline pavement markings implemented to reduce travel lanes and lower vehicle speeds

Cachet Pkwy, Personna Blvd, William Berczy Blvd - These streets are now designated bicycle routes as part of the City's cycling network, with signage installed.

RADAR SPEED DISPLAY BOARDS

Radar speed display boards can be fairly effective at reducing vehicle speeds, resulting in speed reductions by 20% on average. City of Markham will be purchasing an additional radar speed display board for Ward 6 this year which will allow us to place a total of 3 units for each rotation. For the months of April & May, two speed boards have been deployed at these priority locations and two proposed locations in June & July.




SCHOOL ZONE SAFETY

Pilot Program is here! Traffic safety in school zones has become a growing concern in communities throughout the city, specifically with respect to vehicle speeds and pedestrian safety. In 2017, our traffic operations will be proceeding with a city-wide pilot program to implement flexible sign post installations at 8 different schools in the city and these devices will be installed on Castlemore Avenue, within the All Saints Catholic School and Castlemore Public School zones in Ward 6. The objective of the pilot program is to increase driver awareness that they are entering a school zone and therefore must drive in accordance with the posted speed limit and be mindful of increased pedestrian activity. The flexible signs are installed on the centreline of the road, creating a narrowing effect of the driving lane, thereby giving drivers a perception that they need to slow down. At locations where the road is particularly wide, flexible posts near the curb are also provided. During the pilot project, city staff will collect speed data to determine their effectiveness. If successful, consideration will be given to expanding their use at other school zones within the City.

Bur Oak Ave. & Roy Rainey Ave. Traffic Signals:

Council has approved capital budget for the design and installation of traffic signals at the intersection of Bur Oak Ave. and Roy Raine Ave. Our city staff will be proceeding with the design of the traffic signals this spring/summer, anticipated to be completed by yearend. It is expected that once complete, traffic operational safety at the intersection will be improved in particular to the provision of pedestrian signals with countdown displays will help assist students at San Lorenzo Ruiz Catholic School in crossing the street.

PARKING BY-LAW

HOW THE CITY ENFORCES ITS BY-LAWS?

With a few exceptions, the city's by-laws are enforced on a reactive or complaint basis, meaning By-law staff do not go out proactively looking for violations. Instead, staff are instructed in the Three E's of Enforcement and they are:

Educate - Encourage - Enforce

Educate - tell the resident or property owner what it is they are doing wrong;

Encourage - encourage them to correct their behavior and comply with the Officer's instructions and if no compliance is received;

Enforce - take formal action (Notice/Order) where compliance is not achieved

Our goal is compliance and enforcement is the last resort when dealing with a complaint

MUNICIPAL SERVICES

ROAD OPERATIONS

Road Operations is responsible for year-round maintenance of the City's municipal road and sidewalk. The following spring and summer programs are now underway:

- City-wide street sweeping program will be completed in May. All streets are swept a minimum of 4 times per year through the summer and fall months. Our sidewalks sweeping will be complete by the mid to the end of June.
- Complete road rehabilitation began on May 1st and smaller asphalt maintenance will commence is 2 weeks for pot hole, sidewalk and curb type repairs.
- Line marking will begin next week and will continue throughout the summer.
- Sod repairs from winter plow damage should be finished by the end of May.

Mayor Frank Scarpitti held a press conference back on October 25, 2016 to clarify the misinformation and rumors circulating in the community about the Safe Injection Sites. He has confirmed there are no proposals and no need for safe drug injection sites in Markham or in York Region. "In fact, our own York Region Chief Medical Officer has no knowledge that there is a need in Markham or York Region for this, nor has he been consulted about a letter of opinion to state as much." said Mayor Scarpitti. "There are no plans from York Region public health" said York Region's associate medical officer, Dr. Richard Gould.
