TRANSPORTATION & TRANSIT

TRAFFIC SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

New Traffic Signals will be installed at Bur Oak Ave. and Roy Rainey Ave. The City has awarded the contract for the installation of traffic signals, with construction starting this Spring. We anticipate the traffic signals constructed and activated this Summer. Once complete, traffic safety will be improved. In particular, the provision of accessible pedestrian signals with countdown displays will help assist pedestrians and students attending San Lorenzo Ruiz Catholic School in crossing the street.

RADAR SPEED DISPLAY BOARDS



Radar speed display boards can be quite effective at reducing vehicle speeds, resulting in speed reductions by 20% on average. On a regular basis, each radar speed display boards will be located at a particular location for a 3-month period. For the months

from <u>April to June</u>, three speed boards have been deployed at these priority locations.

Speed Monitoring Programs:

Below is a list of locations where radar speed display boards have been deployed from January - March 2018.

- Ridgecrest Rd. (between Brentcliff Gate and Bertram Earnshaw Dr.)
- Mingay Ave. (between Fred McLaren Blvd. and Castlemore Ave.)
- Wilfred Murison Ave (between Stonebridge Dr. and The Bridle Walk)

ROAD WATCH PROGRAM & AGGRESSIVE DRIVING



Road Watch enables residents to report aggressive drivers to York Regional Police online, who will then follow-up with the vehicle's owner. Residents are encouraged to make use of the Road Watch program to report any aggressive driving behaviour they witness, such as speeding and stop sign running. SCHOOL ZONE SAFETY

School Zone Flexible Sign Program—We are expanding! Following a successful pilot program in 2017, the City will be expanding the Centreline Flexible Sign Program from 8 schools to 24 schools in Markham. In Ward 6, Castlemore Public School, All Saints Catholic School, Stonebridge Public School and Donald Cousens Public School will be receiving the flexible signs and posts in their respective school zones in 2018. Pending weather conditions, the flexible sign posts will be installed this April. These flexible signs are installed on the centerline of the road, creating a narrowing effect of the driving lane, thereby giving drivers a perception that they need to slow down and the objective of installing these signs is to increase driver awareness that they are entering a school zone and therefore must drive in accordance with the posted speed limit and be mindful of increased pedestrian activity.



MARKHAM BY-LAW

Just a reminder that you must pay your ticket or schedule an appointment to dispute your ticket within **15 days** from the date the parking ticket was issued to avoid late payment or other administrative fees. TO AVOID PARKING TICKETS:

- Do not park within 9m of any intersection
- Pay close attention to "No Parking" zones
- Do not park within 3m of fire hydrants or access routes
- Do not park on ANY city streets between 2:30am-6:00am

Summer Lawn Care:

Be a good neighbour! Please ensure grass and weeds on your property do not exceed six inches (15cm) in height. Fine could be up to \$250 if not complied.

MUNICIPAL SERVICES

ROAD OPERATIONS

Road Operations is responsible for year-round maintenance of the City's municipal road and sidewalk. The following Spring and Summer programs are now underway:

- City-wide street sweeping program will commence in Spring. All streets are swept a minimum of 2 times per year through the Summer and Fall months. Our sidewalks sweeping will be completed by the mid to the end of June.
- Complete road rehabilitation began on May 1st and smaller asphalt maintenance will commence in 2 weeks for pot hole, sidewalk and curb type repairs.
- Line marking will begin in Spring as soon as weather permit and will continue throughout the Summer.
- Sod repairs from Winter plow damage should be finished by the end of May.
- 19,000 catch basins will be cleaned by early June.

MARKHAM SAFETY

Markham Residents have probably noticed that high-rise residential buildings are becoming increasingly more common in the City's landscape. Due to Ontario Building Code requirements, these buildings are built with provisions to ensure that occupants are alerted to a fire in a timely manner



and that their path of exit is protected during an evacuation. It is important to note that in a residential building the occupant is responsible for his or her own evacuation. While the fire department or property management may be able to provide assistance, the onus is on the occupant to ensure they leave the building safely in a timely manner.

If you live in a high-rise building and notice a fire, pull the fire alarm immediately. If you hear the fire alarm and are able, leave the building immediately. Tell everyone in your unit to get out and close all doors behind you. Use the nearest stairway to exit the building. Do not use the elevator.

If you MUST remain in your unit, close the apartment door. Call 911 and tell the fire department where you are. Beware of smoke entering your apartment and report any signs of smoke to the fire department.

Valley Edge (200 Angus Glen Dr.)

Berczy Beckett Neighborhood Park (89 Harbord St. - Next to Berczy Farm School)

is slated for construction this year for a late Fall 2018 opening.
This park will include a play structure for junior and senior
children, a gazebo and open green field and associated walkway
loop.

Wismer Percy Reesor Parkette (20 Percy Reesor St.)

 will be finished in the Spring and ready for use in Summer 2018. This parkette has a natural setting and includes a small junior play structure.

Wismer McCowan Park (9431 McCowan Rd.)

is slated for construction this year for a Spring 2019 opening.
 This park will include a gazebo and play features for older children and teens

Wismer Alexander Park (81 Alexander Lawrie Ave.)

is slated for construction this year for a Spring 2019 opening.
 This park will include a play structure for junior and senior kids as well as a small spray pad and gazebo.

Wismer Park & Berczy Park North

 Tennis court reconstruction projects are currently underway, to be completed in May 2018.
